ASU Members Win!

A major victory has been won in the midst of these difficult times at Qantas regarding your rosters.

ASU Delegates led by Tony Scott and Gino Boccalatte have worked through an enormous amount of detail to assist with finding a resolution to the many concerns members had with the original draft of the proposed northern summer roster.

Many members in all areas of the ports have taken part in discussions as we have brought you various versions of the drafts which have required checking and cross checking for accuracy – thanks to you all for your assistance.

The rosters are not everyone's dream but they do deliver no more split days off for part-timers, lines reflecting levels working in the correct areas, start and finish times more evenly balanced and a better sharing of the non-penalty shifts. Non-penalty shifts will continue to be an issue, however, Qantas has had to provide significant detail to account for the differential.

We believe this is the best outcome that could be achieved given all of the circumstances, including Easter and the school holidays and impending job losses.

The dispute, which was lodged by the ASU over the rosters has been adjourned until such time as the roster is published and comes into effect on 23 April, 2014.

Meetings continue in relation to the EOI process and consultations are set to begin on the results of the binding nominations closing. A national bulletin will be distributed following the conclusion of those meetings over the next week.
